

The Board of Regents adopted two regulatory amendments related to computer science. The [first amendment](#) allows schools and BOCES to utilize computer science courses to meet career and technical education (CTE) requirements and permits teachers holding a valid Computer Science certificate to obtain the extension in Coordinator of Web-Based Learning Programs for Career Development. The [second amendment](#) extends the implementation timeline for the [computer science statement of continued eligibility](#) (SOCE) by one year. As a result, teachers of computer science courses would not need to hold the Computer Science certificate or SOCE until September 1, 2024.

EMPIRE STATE TEACHER RESIDENCY PROGRAM REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS

Last week, Governor Kathy Hochul [announced](#) the launch of the Empire State Teacher Residency Program (TRP) through the New York State Department of Education (NYSED). Under the [Request for Applications \(RFA\)](#) up to \$30 million in TRP funding will be made available to partially or fully fund master's degree or teaching certification programs for graduate-level K12 teacher candidates who complete a [two-year](#) residency program within a NYS public school district or BOCES program. Fundings would involve the State University of New York (SUNY), the City University of New York (CUNY), and/or NYS private colleges and universities partnering with public school districts/BOCES.
