childhood program. Providers should also consider the schedules and concerns of the regular early childhood settings and the parent when scheduling make-up sessions.

The IEP of each student also specifies a frequency, duration and intensity of SEIS (e.g., $4 \times \text{weekly}$; 30 minute sessions¹²; individual). However, when make-up sessions cannot be provided in the same week as the missed session to meet the IEP recommendations, the frequency of IEP sessions during the make-up week is likely to exceed the IEP frequency for this service. For example, for a student with an IEP recommendation of three SEIS sessions per week, a make-up session provided in a subsequent week would result in a frequency of four sessions in that week.
